

With this touring photo exhibition we invite each visitor to discover the significance of fishing community traditions and their way of life. The photo competition was organized by EUCC – The Coastal Union Germany (EUCC-D). EUCC-D is a non-profit organization founded in 2002 as a national branch of the Coastal & Marine Union (EUCC), which aims to support the sustainable development of coasts and seas through the cooperation in numerous national and international projects. The topic of fisheries, in accordance with the natural & cultural value of coastal regions, is one of EUCC-D's areas of work.

Nowadays, fishery communities around Europe are facing major challenges such as climate change, increasing tourism pressures and the transformation of the fishing industry. The main objective of CHERISH is to develop and implement new strategies to overcome these common challenges, whilst protecting and promoting cultural heritage. The CHERISH partner regions are working together to unlock the economic potential of cultural heritage resources and can already proudly illustrate cases where cultural heritage is successfully used to regenerate the economy and foster sustainable local development.
