The main priority is to improve the region's competitiveness through upgrading and promoting the tourist product and its connection to the cultural and environmental elements of the fishing areas. However, in the Strategy we can see an insufficient balance between economic exploitation of the heritage and quality of life and low financial resource for heritage management.</i></p> <p><i>By extinction of fishing communities, many related cultural heritage will be abolished and replaced with new urban development, which results in loss of part of human cultural heritage. Highlighting the values of fishing cultural heritage helps to promote policies to ensure the continued existence of this tradition as well its associated cultural heritage.</i></p>
